What will we be studying?

In this course students will explore issues related to Canadians, focusing on Canadian governance. Students will explore how the federal political system works by examining the three branches of government, the positions related to each and how they work together to pass policies and laws that affect the everyday lives of Canadian citizens. In the second half of the course, students will explore how the federal government affects the economy by comparing and contrasting Canada's economy with the United States economy. Students will be expected to use their critical thinking skills to explore these topics and to begin developing their own understanding of citizenship and how it relates to government.

The Social Studies 9 course is divided into two main topics:

Governance and Rights

Students will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of how Canada's political processes impact citizenship and identity in an attempt to meet the needs of all Canadians.

Economic Systems

Students will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of how economic decision making in Canada and the United States impacts quality of life, citizenship and identity.

Current Events

We will be examining and reflecting on events in the news throughout the semester. Students are encouraged to watch the news, read newspapers and use the internet to become familiar with what is going on in the world.
