How can playing games and puzzles develop students' critical thinking, creative thinking, and collaboration skills?

Course Content

In this course, students will play different games and puzzles, focusing on developing their critical thinking and collaboration skills. Each class students will play one or more new games and with each game or puzzle they try, students will be required to complete a reflection/rating form.

Evaluation

Students will be assessed individually and in groups. There is no final exam for the course, rather there will be a final project that students will complete to highlight their learning from the course. For their final project, students will be responsible for creating and developing their own game or puzzle.

Resources

Students will play a variety of games during the course, including but not limited to, Monopoly, Trouble, Sudoku, Risk, Qwirkle, Prime Climb, Blokus, etc. All games will be provided for students.
